Proposed Speed Limits – Toll Road and David Finlay VC Place, Guardbridge and Station Road, Leuchars It is recommended, in the interests of road safety that Committee:

1. Agree to the promotion of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to introduce the restrictions detailed in drawing no. TRO/17/31, with all ancillary procedures; and 2. Authorise officers to confirm the Traffic Regulation Orders within a reasonable period unless there are objections. During the site assessment it was discovered that the new housing development road layouts were compatible for a 20mph speed limit, however no traffic order or signing is in place. The C25 Pusk Road has a 40mph speed limit, the A919 Leuchars bypass has a 40mph speed limit and the C3 into Leuchars has a 40mph speed limit. Toll Road over the residential frontage has a 30mph speed limit then reverts to the national speed limit of 60mph. The full length of Station Road from Pusk Road to the A919 Leuchars bypass has a national speed limit of 60mph. To address the disparity that exists in the area the solution would be to reduce the 60mph section of Toll Road and the full length of Station Road to a 40mph speed limit and introduce a 20mph speed limit in David Finlay VC Place. This will introduce consistency with the speed limits and reduce driver confusion with the multiple speed limits that currently exist.

From 24 July 2017 Resource Efficient Solutions will be trialling the sale of food waste bags from 13 of the 14 Fife Sports and Leisure Trust Leisure Centres (not Lumphinnans Sports Hub). Food waste bags will be available at: Waterstone Crook Sports Centre

Details

Food waste bags will be available for £1.30 per roll of 25 bags. The trial will be from 24 July 2017 and a decision will be made by Resource Efficient Solutions and Fife Sports & Leisure Trust in March 2018 on whether to continue.

Standard delivery

The delivery of 3 rolls of food waste bags per year to Fife's householders will continue as normal and is unaffected by this additional service. This trial will allow households to purchase additional bags if they wish.
